**Number to be awarded:** One - annually

**Conditions:** ⇒ Available to a full-time second year student in the Captioning and Court Reporting program at NAIT. Awarded on the basis of academic achievement and community involvement/volunteer work in the hard-of-hearing community

⇒ To be awarded annually to a student after having successfully completed his/her second year of Program

⇒ Proof of successful completion of second year by way of official transcripts.

⇒ Documentation in essay form (ca. 500 words) describing involvement in the hard-of-hearing community (volunteering).

⇒ Preference will be given to residents from the Province of Alberta.

⇒ Program must be taken in residence (not on-line) and be the equivalent of full-time studies.

⇒ Applicants must complete application form and provide:

1. Transcripts of second year of program at NAIT
2. Proof of community involvement
3. Anecdotal information regarding educational background and goals

**Please submit application package by February 28, 2011 to:**

**Application:** Qualified students should complete an application form, which is available from the CCR program office. The applicant will prepare an essay (approximately 500 words) describing his/her community involvement/volunteer activities in the hard-of-hearing community and submit to program staff, who will then verify academic achievement. Program staff will forward the applicant's application, essay and transcript to the donor (CHHA-Edmonton Branch) for selection.
