



HEARING LOOP

Switch Hearing Aid to T-coil

Note: In addition to the hearing loop we have an FM transmitter broadcasting on 106.5 MHz. While in the general vicinity of the church you can tune any FM radio to this frequency and listen.

We are delighted to report that we have installed a hearing loop in this space, covering all pews and the choir seating in front of the organ. The hearing loop is connected to the sound system and is enabled automatically when the sound system is activated.

To use the hearing loop you must have a hearing aid or cochlear implant with a T-coil (T setting) installed and enabled. Fortunately most hearing aids today have a T-coil, even though it may not be enabled. Please consult with your audiologist to determine if your hearing aid has a T-coil, and for instructions on how to use it. Unfortunately there are too many different devices for us to be able to provide specific usage instructions.

Alternately you can access the hearing loop by using a loop listener device (a portable device with a T-Coil and headphones). We have two loop listeners available for use. You are welcome to try a loop listener even if you don't use hearing aids. It will give you an idea of how the system works and you may even find it helps you hear the service better.
